I have been at Twin Brooks Campground since 2004. I enjoy going to the Seabrook Town Beach and understandably last year, because of Covid, I, as so many of us at the campground, could not go because beach parking placards were not issued.

In years past, I generally go to the beach at most once a week, usually on a weekday, and have always found many parking spots available on Hooksett Street even when arriving in the early afternoon. I think most, if not all, people from the campground usually park on Hooksett Street or streets south of there. The north end of the town beach, near the Hampton line, is the most populated area of the beach and that I believe is because there are so many houses in that northern section. Us at the campground usually are on the beach from the Hooksett Street area and to the south where it is sparsely populated and easy to keep our distance from others.

That being said, my suggestions are:

- Do an odd/even parking day based on the placard number.
- Charge a reasonable fee to obtain a beach parking placard.
- Limit beach parking placards to weekday use only. (Although that unfortunately would not be fair to those who only go to the campground on weekends.)

Some may have suggested that vaccination cards be shown in order to receive a placard. I would be careful on that as it could be a violation of HIPPA.

This year, with numbers down and people getting vaccinated, we are nearing herd immunity. I truly hope the Board gives this consideration and will issue the beach parking placards this year.
