**LOCAL POLICE OFFICER COMPLETES MID-MANAGEMENT COURSE
AT ROGER WILLIAMS UNIVERSITY**

BRISTOL, R.I., May 14, 2021 - The Justice System Training and Research Institute at Roger Williams University in Bristol, R.I., in partnership with the New England Association of Chiefs of Police, recently recognized Lieutenant Timothy Mone of the Seabrook NH Police Department for the successful completion of the "Command Training Series: Mid-Management Course," a one-week comprehensive training program for police supervisory personnel.

Coursework addressed contemporary concepts of management and leadership relevant to the responsibilities of a middle manager in a modern criminal justice agency.
