Mrs. Brown opened the meeting at 10:30AM.

MEETING - FIRING RANGE

Mrs. Kyle commented that she is confused about the agenda as the request is for hunter education. She was not informed there was a public meeting.

Heated discussion began and Mrs. Brown took a 5-minute recess at Board reconvened at 10:38AM. 10:32AM.

Mr. Khan spoke and said the selectmen does not have any opportunity to discuss any matter outside of a public meeting. He said the chairperson sets the agenda with consultation with the town manager. The board members cannot reach out to another member it is not legal. The town manager can have the discussions with the other board members. Mr. Khan said Chairwoman Ella Brown asked for this item to be on the agenda through the town manager and he said he has asked for items to be placed on the agenda.

Mrs. Kyle said they receive the agenda on Thursday or Friday so that they can prepare for the meeting on Monday. On Saturday she received a call that there is going to be a big meeting on Monday to discuss the reopening of the gun range. She said she is an elected member to this board and was not notified of the meeting. Mrs. Kyle commented that even the Police Chief of Kensington was notified and is here today, but she was not.

Mr. Khan said the committee was formed by the board and were in process of getting a 501C3 when it was halted by Covid. of people were calling him regarding the status of the range. He feels it is important to pick this back up to see where they are at to getting the range reopened.

Jim Goldthwaite spoke to the hunter education request to utilize the gun range. They believe strongly that hunter education is an important event and will be conducting a course in April.

Don Felch spoke and said he sat on the committee and gave an oversight as to where they are at and where they need to go. In 2019 they were given a set of guidelines to follow to run a gun range here in Seabrook. They have met almost every aspect of the guidelines. The only hindrance was too open using no taxpayer subsidy. They have looked at ways of generating revenue but needed to get a 501C3 which was put on hold due to Covid. The paperwork will be filed this week which will allow them to receive donations and produce revenue.

The committee has 2 open seats, and it needs to be reestablished so they can move forward and hold a meeting. They are now looking to keep it to residents only and it will be much easier for them to manage. Don Felch said they have looked into the insurance, but he doesn't have the numbers right in front of him, but he knows some of the numbers have doubled.

Mr. Manzi commented they could ask conservation to have a member present on the committee. He believes the fire member will be resolved after he speaks to the chief.

To increase the size of the committee by 4 members in order to get this program moving forward.

Mr. Khan said they have people here in the room that would be happy to serve on the committee - Mike Pike, Casey Carter, Patrick Knott and Ravi. Don Felch doesn't feel they need to reinvent the wheel.

Mike Pike said the firing range needs to open as people are out shooting in the woods behind houses which is not safe. He said it is not just about hunting, but it is somewhere to go with the children and teach them on gun safety. He asked why they couldn't move the range so that it is on town property in Seabrook rather than in Kensington.

Mrs. Kyle said this is not funded by the town and is not subsidized by tax dollars. Mr. Manzi said that maybe after looking at the ideas they may want to consider the options. However, Kensington has not been completely negative on the opening of the gun range. Mr. Manzi said they would like us to open it safely and the town has looked at putting in some safety measures. He feels this should be discussed at the committee and then have it come forward to the board with a suggestion of moving the range to do it safely. He feels it should be worked

out in the committee and they will bring back a solid recommendation to the board.

Police Chief Scott Cain of Kensington said they will object to a firing range the way it is right now. He said to open it up to Kensington residents not just Seabrook would put a better light on getting it passed by the board. He said safety protocols need to be put in place and lights need to be put in place through solar panels, etc. to monitor the area. Since the range has been closed there have been no bullets found at CP Lumber. He feels there needs to be a full proposal brought to his board in Kensington before they agree to reopen the range.

Mr. Manzi said he has had many conversations with Attorney Bower, so this is a little redundant. Once there is a full proposal, they could invite the board of Kensington to attend that meeting so they can sell the proposal to both. The proposal needs to ensure the safety of all those involved.

Police Chief Brett Walker said there is no one here that is opposed to opening the range, but it needs to be done properly. Adding additional members to the committee just adds more people but you already have the members working towards the same goal.

Bobby Brown spoke and said every meeting was posted and anyone that wants to attend the meeting could. They did not have to be on the committee to voice their opinion or ideas.

Casey Carter said he doesn't want to see the range closed or given up on like the BMX track. He is a big advocate for recreation, and he works for the parks and cemeteries for the town. He said the property could also be used for fishing where they could hold fishing derbies. He said the town should be keeping an eye on this area by fencing it off and installing cameras. He said people move to this town not for a million-dollar home but rather for the amenities the town offers. He said they could use the Friends of Seabrook Community for the range, and it is already a 501C3.

Mrs. Kyle said she is dismayed there is no member of the beach precinct on the committee. Don Felch said the seat has already been available but there was never any interest in it. Mr. Manzi went over the members from the original committee. Mrs. Kyle will bring this up at the next beach precinct meeting.

Maria Brown commented that if they put more members on a committee they have always asked for letters of interest and it doesn't look good if the new members are hand-picked at a public meeting, so for the future they should continue the way they have in the past.

Board took a 5-minute break at 11:48AM. Board reconvened at 12:04PM.

MONTHLY MEETING - DPW MANAGER

John Starkey was present for his monthly report (see attached). He spoke about the vehicles that are being repaired after the last snowstorm and the warrant article that is on the ballot. He said even if the dump truck is approved there is a good chance, he would not get it for one year as it needs to be built and outfitted.

John Starkey spoke about the paving program and the article on the ballot. The largest share of this fund is raised by the highway block grant with the smallest amount being raised by taxation. He has provided a memo on where he would like to focus on the paving in 2022. He is hoping to get the board to approve the contract with Continental Paving by piggybacking on with the state bid price. John Starkey spoke about using the church parking lot which is already in bad shape, and this would make it worse so he is suggesting they pave the parking lot, and it would cost about \$9K. Mr. Manzi said they would need to reach an agreement with the private landowner, and he would handle this matter.

MONTHLY MEETING - RECREATION DIRECTOR

Cassandra Carter was present for her monthly report (see attached). She spoke about the upcoming programs for spring. She said things are going back to normalcy and feels it is the time to do so. There is a leak in the gym, but it is already being fixed. Mrs. Brown said she is doing a great job and things are getting back to normal and she loves that.

Lt. Tim Mone spoke in regard to the collective bargaining agreement that is on the ballot. He said this union is comprised of the department heads who run the departments. He thanked the board, town manager and budget committee for support of the article and is asking for the taxpayers to come out and support this article.

Mrs. Kyle commented that some of the supervisors are making less than those they supervise, and this will bring them current with other union contracts. Mr. Khan said they spent many hours negotiating this contract and brings a win-win for both the taxpayers and the union members. Mrs. Brown said it is a fair contract and did spend hours on negotiating to make it right for the supervisors. They have all asked for the support on this article.

The scale at the transfer station is 25 years old and needs to be repaired in order to keep it open. Article 27 is for lease of the Sanborn School that has been vacant for several years. There will be no cost to the taxpayers and will assist the town with the drug issue in town. Mrs. Brown said it will also be used for families that need support such as grandparents who are now raising their grandkids. Mrs. Kyle said she is not in favor of this article as it is not exclusive for Seabrook people. She feels the best use for this dilapidated building is to sell it and bring money to the town.

The board encouraged all voters to come out and vote on Tuesday, March 8 from 7AM - 7PM at the Community Center.

Mrs. Brown thanked the residents in the town for electing her to the board for the last 6 years and hopes all voters will come out and vote tomorrow.

Here is what I recommend:


- Get under contract immediately with Continental Paving (Hudson N.H.) We can with this asphalt producer (Largest in N.H.) piggybank on State Bid Prices
- Complete all of the 2022 paving goals and objectives before Memorial Day
- Keep last year's promise of paving Dow's Lane
- Finish the paving started on Eisenhower Street (Beach Street)
- Shift from north beach streets (last 3 years) to be fair and start on south beach streets completing 2 or 3 short streets
- Begin milling and resurfacing (2-year project) Lake Shore Drive development (worst streets)
- Rehab DPW parking lot (Note: Recreation-2020, Police Dept.-2021, DPW-2022, Fire Dept.-2023)



Policies & Procedures

Attire—Non-marking sneakers are required by any participant in gym activities. Shirts must be worn in all areas. Undergarment must be covered up.

☐ Cancellations- Classes may be cancelled due to the lack of enrollment. All those registered for such a class, may receive credit toward another program or receive a refund. In the event of inclement weather, some programs may be cancelled.

School Aged Youth Using Facility-

School age youth are not allowed to use the building during school hours. Regular youth hours start at 2:45pm. Children 10 years and under must leave the Rec. at 6pm, and children 11 & 12 years must leave the gym at 6pm and go to the game room until 7pm, unless they are with a parent or adult who is directly supervising them or engaging in the same activity. Children less than the **third grade** may not be dropped off to use the building, unless they are attending a structured class or team practice. Youth age 10 & under need adult supervision outdoors.

□Eligibility Requirements - Most of our programs are offered at three different rates, which includes 2 rates for members and 1 rate for non-members. A few programs & facilities are limited to members only, for example the exercise room is limited to members. We also have some programs that are limited to resident members first, such as summer camp.

Ilndividuals without a SRD ID— Any person who does not have a current SRD ID Card must stop at main office to sign in and pay the appropriate drop-in fee. Anyone age 15 years old & older, must show other ID such as a drivers license or school ID.
