- Officer Storms ran her second Boston Marathon on Monday April 17, 2023 as part of a team representing the <u>Officer Sean A. Collier Memorial Fund</u>. Congratulations to Officer Storms for completing the Marathon again and for beating her previous time.
- Staff completed training in topics to include some of "The Three 2's" (ethics, de-escalation, and bias), narcotics training from the DEA, SWAT school, accreditation, and AFIS (fingerprinting).
- Members of the Seabrook PD participated in Walk to School Day with Seabrook Middle and Elementary Schools.
- ACO Baillargeon, Sgt. Smart, and Ofc. Smick rescued six ducklings from a storm drain adjacent to Lafayette Road. This was a story that was picked up by local media outlets.
- The Seabrook PD investigated a non-fatal stabbing that occurred in the area of South Main Street by the Fire Barn. Two individuals were subsequently arrested in connection with the incident.
- The Seabrook PD participated in National Prescription Drug Takeback Day hosted by the DEA. A reminder to residents that we have a drop box inside the lobby of the PD that is available 24/7/365. Please no "sharps". If you have any needles/lancets/etc. please notify the dispatcher and an officer will be assigned to take those items from you to be destroyed.
- Members of the Seabrook PD assisted with and participated in the Memorial Day parade.
- Officer Mascioli, Det. Butcher, Officers Hines, Storms, Couch, Glowacki and police/Special Olympics supporter Kaiden participated in the Special Olympics Torch Run. Officer Storms also volunteered her time during Special Olympics events and a cruiser parade held at the University of New Hampshire.
- Attended an ACERT meeting (Adverse Childhood Experiences Response Team) at the Fire Department with other stakeholders. This meeting was to explain the program and see what resources are available and explore the possibility of implementation in our community.
- Attended a meeting of the Gun Range Committee at Town Hall.
- <u>National Police Week</u> 2023 started Sunday May 14th and went through Saturday May 20th with May 15th being National Peace Officer Memorial Day. During this time we remember all our brothers and sisters who lost their lives serving and protecting their communities especially Seabrook Police Chief <u>Charles S. "King" Knowles</u> who died in the line of duty on August 12, 1973.

- We are currently hiring for one full-time police dispatcher.
 - This dispatch position will be the fifth full-time dispatcher and put us at full staff.
- We are currently fully staffed with 30 full-time police officer positions filled.
