There was discussion on the manpower for the department. They are doing more than what other communities are doing. Chief Edwards said when an employee retires, we do ask them to put them on the call list.

There was discussion on the hiring for the department. Since opening up the moving into town to 5 years we have had more applicants coming in. Chief Edwards said it is hard to quantify time for his department as the operation is different than that of someone who does administrative duties.

Diana Chapman - asked if the high school has a career fair to educate the students for recruitment purposes. Chief Edwards spoke to the program they are involved in to educate the students about the fire program.

Mr. Manzi said he is working towards updating and adopting the larger policies on an annual basis. The investment policy does have some substantial changes. He said he has not heard any opposition from the treasurer in regard to the investment policy.

Mr. Eaton said as the stewards of the taxpayers they can make recommendations for investments. Mr. Manzi said the board has the authority to have a conversation with the treasurer and to make appropriate suggestions.

Justin Packard - asked if they could get included in the policy a forecast of the cash flow. Mr. Manzi said he doesn't necessarily agree it needs to be included in the policy. However, the selectmen can demand that the statement be provided. Mr. Manzi said previously even in 2024 there were issues with the cash flow reconciliations. He said the cash flow reconciliations today are up-to-date and being handled by the finance office.

Justin Packard said they should bring in the NH investment pool where they get the treasury rate on investment and demand our local banks match the rate.

Mr. Eaton would like to have a quarterly meeting with the treasurer, so they know where they stand financially. HE, AK, U to bring the treasurer to meeting schedule.

Mr. Eaton would like to have the NH investment pool for discussion before January 1, 2027.

Mr. Eaton suggested adopting the policy as written and then amending it once they decide what they want to do with the cash

flow. Mr. Manzi said they have authority to amend any policy without a complete overhaul of the policy.

Mrs. Kyle asked if it puts the board in a different position if the position is elected or appointed. Mr. Manzi said the treasurer has always been amenable to the recommendations set by the board. The elected party has statutory powers, but the policy is set by the selectmen. The treasurer can delegate the policy to other parties.

Mr. Carter came into the meeting about the policy. He said he has no issues with the policy. Mr. Eaton asked if he could have the NH investment pool to discuss an account with them. Mr. Carter said we have an account with them and have about \$6K in the account. He said one thing is the NH investment pool does not collatarize investments. He said TD Bank does collatarize and that protects the town funds. Currently the town is getting a little over 3%, but it changes all the time.

NO PARKING RESTRICTION - LEDGE ROAD

Mr. Manzi said this comes from a series of serious complaints by the residents. There will be signage involved for the road. He would also recommend holding a public hearing.

Jason Janvrin - said he has also received complaints. Ledge Road once you get to London Lane there is nowhere for a tractor trailer truck to turn around. He would recommend a sign before London Lane to say tractor trailers must turn right and then a sign after London Lane that says local deliveries only.

Mr. Eaton agrees that there are homeowners who do park their cars in the available spaces while the driveway is empty. He wants everybody to be able to enjoy the beautiful beach.

Mr. Khan said he received calls that over 4th of July weekend there were no issues with parking at the beach. He said many people were asked why they didn't attend the meeting and consensus was they are so fed up with this issue and didn't feel it would matter.

Mr. Khan said the board attended Old Home Days, and it was well attended. He said the committee members who organized the 250th celebration had a wonderful day. He would like to bring them into a future meeting to recognize each of them for all their hard work. They can hold this meeting later in the day so everyone can attend.

Mrs. Kyle commented about Wreaths Across America and if anyone is interested, they can reach out to April Koney.

Mrs. Kyle thanked the police department for work on handling someone who was peering into windows at 2AM.

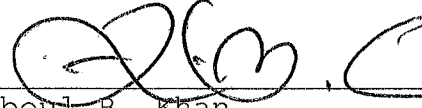

Hello,

Since our last meeting we've had quite a few Town events, the Seabrook 250th Celebration, Memorial Day Parade, National Night Out, and Old Home Days! It's been a very busy few months for the community. I'd like to say all of the departments and community members who worked to put all of these events on did an amazing job. The next event for the Fire Dept will be the Annual Touch-a-Truck Event the first week in October during Fire Prevention Week.

At the Fire Dept we are still working with our new hires to get through their classes and complete the on duty training. Most of the new hires have completed their first year EMS and State fire requirements. Now it will mostly be completing our probationary period and continuing to learn from our senior firefighters. We have filled our ranks on the floor and through provisional hires, we are awaiting a few more classes and certifications to start the newest firefighters. We hope in the coming months to be at full staff on the floor.

We have initiated the Boiler project from our meeting a few weeks ago and should be getting the work completed in the next 4-6 weeks. We appreciate the Board making this happen and helping us get this done before we hit the cold season.

We have also gotten the ball rolling on the communication article passed this past March. The company has started the initial phases of the work at our Sam's Club tower and has been in the station to prepare for the next steps.

On the SAFER & AFG grants we applied for, we are in the waiting phase of the process. Right now we have submitted, the grants have moved to the review stage and we are waiting for a response to see what our next steps are.

From our work with MRI on ambulance billing we have started some of the policies and practices they recommended. We have been working to fill all the boxes so to speak required to ensure we are billing at our max capacity.

Emergency Management had our CFE on June 3rd, this is a practice drill leading up to the graded drill in late September. The feedback we received was that the drill went well for Seabrook, there were some communication issues that needed to be corrected. We have discussed these and will make the changes necessary for the graded drill.

It's almost budget season again and we've been working with the Town Manager on the budgets for both Fire and Emergency Management. I'm sure we will have another spirited budget process this year as in years past.

RE: Response to complaints regarding parking on Ledge Road.

In response to the concerns sent to the Town Hall regarding parking along Ledge Road I submit the following observations and recommendations:

We have received complaints related to tractor trailers/commercial vehicles parking along the north side of Ledge Road, idling, leaving trash, urinating, etc. I have personally reviewed the area and there are no "No Parking" signs. While some of the complaints may be more easily addressed by law enforcement, the underlying issue is the ability to park in this location. A parking prohibition would allow greater enforcement opportunities and, ultimately, eliminate the underlying issue.

The first item to check would be ownership of the property. In reviewing the maps on VisionAppraisal I believe the land in question is owned by the Town of Seabrook, or at least in the Town's right-of-way, but we should verify.

Second, I've reviewed Town Ordinance Chapter 249 (Vehicles and Traffic, attached), and I did not see anything specific to this location as far as parking prohibitions. While we do have an overnight camping prohibition in the ordinances, designating this area as a "No Parking" zone would allow us to conduct the desired enforcement activities.

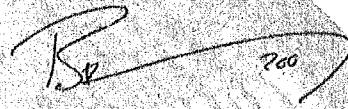
My recommendation would be for the Board of Selectmen to add language to Town Ordinance Chapter 249-25 (Parking Prohibited at All Times) to include Ledge Road or whatever portion, thereof, that they feel is appropriate. An example of suggested language to add under this chapter would be, "Ledge Road, North/South, from Batchelder Road to London Lane." This may require input from businesses and/or abutters but is an example of what would be a foundation for enforcement efforts.

During my inspection of the site I located a "Left Lane Must Turn Left" sign face down in the brush in one of the areas that appears to be used for parking. This appears to be a simple fix with a new pole and to reset the sign. This is on the north side of the road just beyond utility pole 48 | 25 and across the street from Midway Utility Contractors. However, this specific signage, while needed for traffic in the area, is not a substitute for the recommended signage. Rather, the sign should help block a portion of the area for parking while also providing the desired message to traffic in the area.

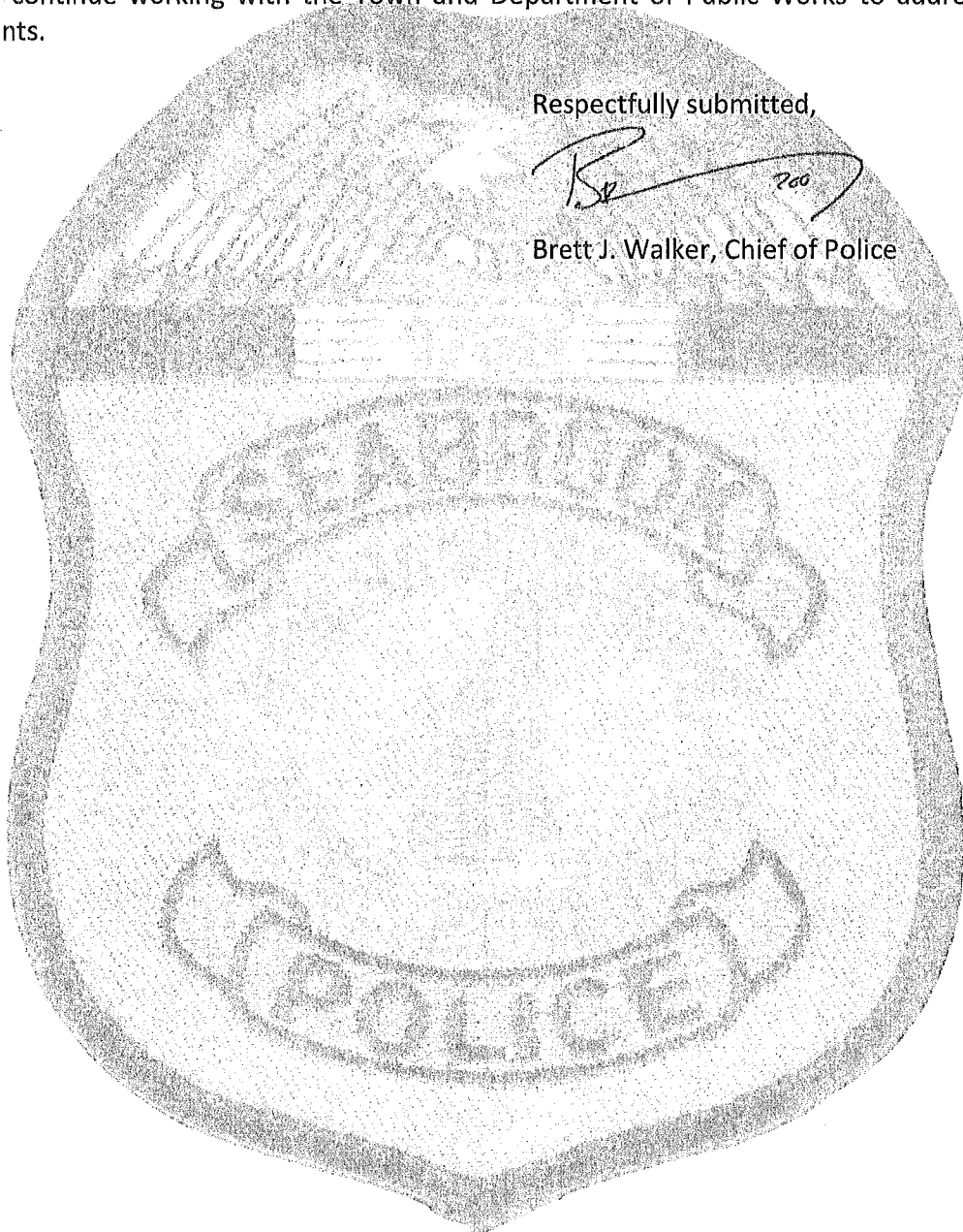
A quick band-aid might be to move some of the signage closer to the road so it is in the areas being used to park. This is also not a substitute for the requested signage but would provide a physical deterrent to parking in that area.

We will continue working with the Town and Department of Public Works to address these complaints.

ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 249

VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

In accordance with and under the authority of RSA 41:11 and RSA 47:17, VII and VIII, and pursuant to Chapter 249, Article I, § 249-1, *Amendments*, of the Code of the Town of Seabrook, the Board of Selectmen hereby enacts the following amendment to Chapter 249, Article IV, § 249-25, Schedule VI, *Parking Prohibited at All Times*.

Section 1. Amendment to § 249-25, Schedule VI.

Chapter 249, § 249-25, Schedule VI, *Parking Prohibited at All Times*, is hereby amended by adding the following street location:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Ledge Road	North	From Batchelder Road to London Lane

In accordance with § 249-11, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon the portion of Ledge Road described above.

Section 2. Signage.

The Department of Public Works is authorized and directed to install appropriate **NO PARKING** signage along the north side of Ledge Road from Batchelder Road to London Lane sufficient to provide notice of the parking prohibition established by this amendment.

Section 3. Effective Date.

This amendment shall take effect upon its adoption by the Board of Selectmen.
